### **Remembrance Day 2018:**

#### **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Armistice of the First World War**

An Armistice is an agreement made by opposing sides in a war to cease fighting at a certain time. On Sunday, August 4, 1918, the fourth anniversary of the declaration of what became known as the Great War, King George V and Queen Mary joined members of the British House of Commons and the House of Lords for a special service at the Church of Saint Margaret, Westminster. The King asked that August 4, 1918 be observed as a national day of prayer. One hundred days later, the *Armistice of Compiegne* came into effect at 11am Paris time on November 11, 1918. While this ended the First World War, the Armistice needed to be extended three times until the signing of the Treaty of Versailles in June, 1919. This is why some people date the ending of WWI to 1919.
